



The Dogwood Invitational Honors Deserving Reynolds Scholars at Druid Hills Golf Club
Wayne Reynolds Scholarships Awarded to Standout Junior Golfers During Tournament Am-Am

ATLANTA – June 13, 2014 – This year, The Dogwood Invitational will honor the recipients of the 2014 Wayne Reynolds Scholarship during The Dogwood Am-Am Reception. Each year, The Wayne Reynolds Scholarship Foundation (WRSF) awards two qualified junior golfers with annual grants to two or four-year accredited colleges and universities, with help from The Dogwood Foundation. Andrew Phillips, a 2012 graduate of Morgan County High School, and Joseph Schoon, a 2014 graduate of Sandy Creek High School are the 28th and 29th recipients of the scholarship.

Andrew Phillips, a graduate of Morgan County High School in Madison, will enter his junior year at the University of West Georgia (UWG). A dedicated student and athlete, Phillips is a leader in golf and in the classroom. He is a member of the UWG Golf team, and The National Society of Collegiate Scholars. In 2012, he was inducted as a member of the AA 2012 All State Boys Golf Team, and has been involved in Campus Outreach during his time at UWG.

Joseph Schoon is a 2014 graduate of Sandy Creek High School in Tyrone, and will attend The University of Georgia this fall. Schoon's love for the outdoors and nature has been the driving factor of his projected field of study, Forestry. Over the years, he's been a disciplined worker in the classroom and in his athletic career. He is currently a member of the math team, the co-captain of his academic team, president of the Sandy Creek chapter of The National Honors Society, received the University of Georgia Merit Award, is on the varsity golf team, junior varsity baseball team, and more. Schoon is also ranked academically as no. 6 in his graduating class.
